JOINING INSTRUCTIONS AND CONFERENCE MAP

1. Main Venue

The Sir Charles Wilson Building on the corner of Gibson St and Kelvin Way, Glasgow. Both the map (below) and the Conference Programme refer to the rooms used during the Conference

CWLT – the main Conference venue, the Lecture Theatre in the Sir Charles Wilson Building
CWSR1 – one of the seminar rooms in the basement of the Sir Charles Wilson Building
CWSR2 – the other seminar room in the basement!

On Thursday 30th we shall also be using the building next door – the Gilmorehill Centre.

GSASC – the Sir Andrew Stewart Cinema
217A – room 217A in the Gilmorehill Centre
217B – (unsurprisingly) room 217B in the Gilmorehill Centre

On Friday 1st the Gilmorehill Centre is not available to us so we shall be using the CWLT as a session venue and also two rooms in the University Union nearby

UUBL – the Bridie Library in the University Union
UURR – the Reading Room in the University Union

All sessions – whether it be Keynote, Roundtable or Paper presentation are listed with one of the codes above so you will know where to go.

Guides will be on hand to direct lost souls and all rooms will be signposted and identified with the above codes (except the CWLT – which is hard to miss!)

2. Sustenance

a. All conference Lunches and Coffee breaks will be served in the ‘Foyer’ of the CWLT. Bottled water will be available in rooms on the Thursday afternoon as there is no coffee break after lunch (a consequence of Calvinist zeal!)

b. The Civic Reception (Wednesday) will take place in the wonderful Glasgow City Chambers in George Square. Buses will transport delegates and return them to the pick up point (near the Conference venue) after the Reception.

c. The Conference Dinner and Ceilidh (Thursday) will take place in the University Union – dinner in the Dining Room, ceilidh in the Debating Chamber. Delegates will be entertained at the latter by the 'Rusty Nails Ceilidh Band' and, for those whose enthusiasm exceeds their acquaintance with Scottish country dance, the band will guide participants through the steps. A cash bar will be open in the Debating Chamber.
