	Evaluating a learning community Dr Leone Wheeler	
	Dr Leone Wheeler is an Educational Services Consultant, Associate of RMIT University, School of Global, Urban and Social Studies and Teaching Associate within the School of Education at Monash University. Leone's research interests and practitioner work have focussed on the development and evaluation of Australian Learning Communities, in particular those communities located in the outer suburban areas of metropolitan Melbourne. She is Deputy Chair of the Hume Global Learning Village and a committee member on Northern Metropolitan Melbourne RDA.	This workshop will provide a brief overview of evaluation forms and approaches used by learning community practitioners in Victoria to measure the impact of their work. Participants will apply a Learning Community Framework diagnostic tool, developed in 2013 as part of the Learning as a Driver for Change project, to their own learning community plans and projects. The workshop will conclude with a discussion of how practitioner work on evaluation can link to international Learning Cities Frameworks.
